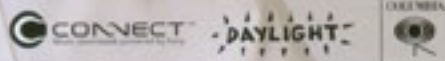

Her identical twin sister, Kindel, was grief-stricken but she was also determined that Courtney's death would not be in vain. **Courtney's Crusade**, which Kindel founded in 2000, has since raised over \$70,000 to purchase AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators), used to jump-start a heart in arrest, for use in Houston area schools and businesses.

Founded by Lisa in 1999 as a response to her own underprivileged childhood, **SAFE (School Activities For Everyone)** underwrites disadvantaged students' expenses for extracurricular activities, and is also home to Cinderella's Closet, providing free prom dresses to girls in need. In six years, the organization has given over \$90,000 in grants, outfitted hundreds of girls for proms, awarded nine college scholarships and opened TAGS, a retail boutique that benefits SAFE's efforts.
